Description of Revenue Sources

To this revenue head is credited all income generated by government-operated public utilities except government toll-tunnels and bridges.

Revenue from utilities generated 1.0% of general revenue in 2003-04.

Underlying Changes in Revenue Yield

The **2003–04** revised estimate of \$2,850,096,000 is a net decrease of \$551,416,000 (16.2%) against the original estimate.

Under *Subhead 070 Waterworks* the decrease of \$390,590,000 (15.7%) is mainly due to the water charge concession for the four-month billing period starting from August 2003 as part of the package of SARS relief measures.

Under *Subhead 080 Sewage services* the decrease of \$149,271,000 (21.3%) is mainly due to the sewage charge and trade effluent surcharge concessions for the four-month billing period starting from August 2003 as part of the package of SARS relief measures.

The **2004–05** estimate of \$3,434,582,000 is a net increase of \$584,486,000 (20.5%) over the revised estimate for 2003–04.

Under *Subhead 040 Marine ferry terminals* the increase of \$25,245,000 (12.2%) is mainly due to the anticipated increase in the number of passengers after the setback caused by the outbreak of SARS in 2003.

Under *Subhead 070 Waterworks* the increase of \$403,239,000 (19.3%) takes into account a slight anticipated increase in water consumption and the effect of the cessation of the water charge concession in 2004–05.

Under *Subhead 080 Sewage services* the increase of \$156,002,000 (28.4%) takes into account a slight anticipated increase in water consumption and the effect of the cessation of the sewage charge and trade effluent surcharge concessions in 2004–05.
