17 The need for objective, up-to-date and quality statistical information to facilitate policy planning in the Government as well as community understanding and discussion of public issues continues to increase. To meet this need, the Department will continue to upgrade the quality of statistical services in respect of timeliness, relevance and user serviceability. It will continue to co-ordinate statistical activities across government departments to ensure data compatibility and maintain quality standards.

Analysis of Financial and Staffing Provision

Programme (1)

Provision for 2012–13 is \$18.0 million (12.9%) higher than the revised estimate for 2011–12. This is mainly due to the additional operating expenses for conducting supplementary surveys to track the latest development in the trade structure of Hong Kong as well as the increased salary provision for filling of vacancies and staff changes.

Provision for 2012–13 is \$248.6 million (71.6%) lower than the revised estimate for 2011–12. This is mainly due to the reduced operating expenses for the 11C and the net decrease of nine posts in 2012–13, partly offset by the increased salary provision for filling of vacancies and staff changes.

The estimate of the amount required in 2012–13 for the salaries and expenses of the Census and Statistics Department is \$576,367,000. This represents a decrease of \$196,542,000 against the revised estimate for 2011–12 and an increase of \$32,266,000 over actual expenditure in 2010–11.

2 Provision of \$571,367,000 under *Subhead 000 Operational expenses* is for the salaries, allowances and other operating expenses of the Census and Statistics Department. The decrease of \$196,442,000 (25.6%) against the revised estimate for 2011–12 is mainly due to the reduced provision for the 2011 Population Census partly offset by the additional operating expenses for conducting supplementary surveys to track the latest development in the trade structure of Hong Kong.

3 The establishment as at 31 March 2012 will be 1 220 permanent posts. It is expected that there will be a net decrease of two permanent posts in 2012–13. Subject to certain conditions, the controlling officer may under delegated power create or delete non-directorate posts during 2012–13, but the notional annual mid-point salary value of all such posts must not exceed \$374,801,000.
