#### Matters Requiring Special Attention in 2012-13

- **6** During 2012–13, the Branch will:
- prepare legislation to extend the existing import control regime for meat and poultry to cover poultry eggs;
- prepare legislation to strengthen control over pesticide residues in food;
- prepare legislative amendments to the Pesticides Ordinance (Cap.133) to fulfill the obligations of the Government under the Stockholm Convention and the Rotterdam Convention;
- continue to collaborate with the Mainland authorities to explore the feasibility of applying information technology in enhancing the traceability of food;

### Programme (1)


Provision for 2012–13 is \$1.1 million (11.5%) higher than the revised estimate for 2011–12. This is mainly due to the lower than expected salary payment in 2011–12 due to staff changes.


#### Programme (2)

Provision for 2012–13 is \$11.9 million (41.0%) higher than the revised estimate for 2011–12. This is mainly due to the lower than expected expenditure in 2011–12 for meeting contingencies arising from zoonotic diseases and food incidents.

#### Programme (3)

Provision for 2012–13 is \$7.3 million (37.2%) higher than the revised estimate for 2011–12. This is mainly due to the increased provision for planning and development of columbarium and crematorium facilities and for conducting consultancy studies. One post will be created in 2012-13 for strengthening clerical support.

#### **Details of Expenditure by Subhead**

The estimate of the amount required in 2012–13 for the salaries and expenses of the Food Branch is \$78,531,000. This represents an increase of \$20,331,000 over the revised estimate for 2011–12 and of \$22,553,000 over actual expenditure in 2010–11.

#### Operating Account

#### Recurrent

- **2** Provision of \$78,531,000 under *Subhead 000 Operational expenses* is for the salaries, allowances and other operating expenses of the Food Branch. The increase of \$20,331,000 (34.9%) over the revised estimate for 2011–12 is mainly due to the lower than expected expenditure in 2011–12 for meeting contingencies arising from zoonotic diseases and food incidents, and the increased provision for planning and development of columbarium and crematorium facilities and for conducting consultancy studies.
- **3** The establishment as at 31 March 2012 will be 45 permanent posts and one supernumerary post. It is expected that there will be a net increase of one post in 2012–13. Subject to certain conditions, the controlling officer may under delegated power create or delete non-directorate posts during 2012–13, but the notional annual mid-point salary value of all such posts must not exceed \$20,075,000.
