Aim

2 The aim is to provide the Electoral Affairs Commission with administrative support in the effective discharge of its statutory functions under the Electoral Affairs Commission Ordinance (Cap. 541) to ensure that elections are conducted openly, honestly and fairly.

Brief Description

3 The Registration and Electoral Office (REO) will, under the direction of the Electoral Affairs Commission, implement the decisions of the Commission in relation to:

- the review and delineation of geographical constituencies for the Legislative Council and District Council constituencies;
- the registration of electors; and
- the conduct and supervision of elections.

4 During 2011–12, the REO provided the Electoral Affairs Commission with administrative support to accomplish a number of major tasks, including:

- the promotion and conduct of a voter registration exercise to prepare for the 2011 District Council election and the 2011 Election Committee subsector elections;
- the publication of registers of electors for geographical constituencies, functional constituencies and Election Committee subsectors;
- the publication of an interim register and a final register of members of the Election Committee;
- the enhancement of checking of electors in the current register in respect of their registered addresses;
- the feasibility study of conducting cross-matching exercise with other government departments on electors' registration particulars;
- additional publicity measures to remind electors to update their addresses with REO if there are any changes;
- the making of subsidiary legislation on voter registration and electoral arrangements for the District Council election, the Election Committee subsector elections and the Chief Executive election;
- the issuing of guidelines for the conduct of 2011 District Council election, the 2011 Election Committee subsector elections and the 2012 Chief Executive election;
- the updating of the guidelines for the Village Representative elections to reflect mainly the latest legislative amendments;

- the conduct and supervision of the 2011 District Council election, the 2011 Election Committee subsector elections, the 2012 Chief Executive election, and two District Council by-elections;
- the supervision of the conduct of two Village Representative by-elections;
- the submission of reports to the Chief Executive on the 2011 Village Representative ordinary election, the 2011 District Council election, two District Council by-elections and two Village Representative by-elections;



Analysis of Financial and Staffing Provision

Provision for 2012–13 is \$208.5 million (52.5%) higher than the revised estimate for 2011–12. This is mainly due to increased requirements for the conduct of the 2012 Legislative Council election, partly offset by the reduction in requirements for the 2011 District Council election, the 2011 Election Committee subsector elections and the 2012 Chief Executive election.

Details of Expenditure by Subhead

The estimate of the amount required in 2012–13 for the salaries and expenses of the Registration and Electoral Office (REO) is \$605,648,000. This represents an increase of \$208,541,000 over the revised estimate for 2011–12 and of \$408,494,000 over the actual expenditure in 2010–11.

Operating Account

Recurrent

2 Provision of \$605,648,000 under *Subhead 000 Operational expenses* is for the salaries, allowances and other operating expenses of the REO. The increase of \$208,541,000 (52.5%) over the revised estimate for 2011–12 is mainly due to increased requirements for the conduct of the 2012 Legislative Council election, partly offset by the reduction in requirements for the 2011 District Council election, the 2011 Election Committee subsector elections and the 2012 Chief Executive election.

3 The establishment as at 31 March 2012 will be 185 permanent posts and one supernumerary post. No change in establishment is expected in 2012–13. Subject to certain conditions, the controlling officer may under delegated power create or delete non-directorate posts during 2012–13, but the notional annual mid-point salary value of all such posts must not exceed \$73,930,000.
