Brief Description

- **3** The Registration and Electoral Office is the executive arm of the Electoral Affairs Commission. It will, under the direction of the Commission, implement the decisions of the Commission in relation to:
 - the review and delineation of geographical constituencies for the Legislative Council and District Council constituencies;
 - the registration of electors; and
 - the conduct and supervision of elections.
- **4** During 2001–02, the Registration and Electoral Office provided the Electoral Affairs Commission with administrative support to accomplish a number of major tasks, including:
 - the conduct and supervision of one Legislative Council Election Committee by-election;
 - the publication of registers of electors for geographical constituencies, functional constituencies, Election Committee and subsectors;
 - the making of subsidiary legislation on electoral arrangements for the Election Committee subsector elections and the Chief Executive election;
 - the issue of guidelines for the conduct of the Election Committee subsector elections and the 2002 Chief Executive election;
 - the conduct and supervision of the Election Committee subsector by-elections and the 2002 Chief Executive election; and

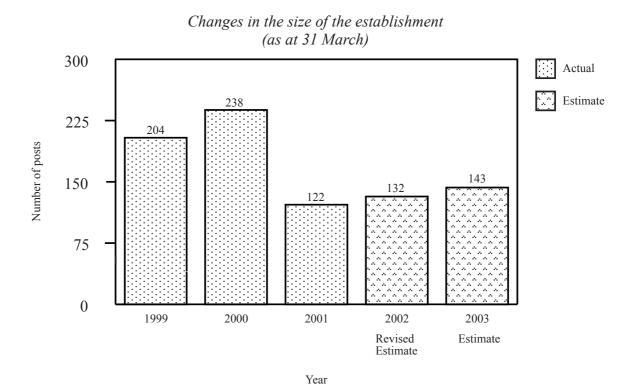

Analysis of Financial and Staffing Provision

Provision for 2002–03 is \$51.0 million (79.9%) higher than the revised estimate for 2001–02. This is mainly due to increased requirement for the preparation of the 2003 District Council elections and the net creation of 11 temporary posts for undertaking election-related duties and for the development of the new EARS.

Details of Expenditure by Subhead

The estimate of the amount required in 2002–03 for the salaries and expenses of the Registration and Electoral Office is \$114,805,000. This represents an increase of \$51,014,000 over the revised estimate for 2001–02 and a decrease of \$178,853,000 against actual expenditure in 2000–01.

Recurrent Account

Personal Emoluments

- **2** Provision of \$47,396,000 for personal emoluments represents an increase of \$8,449,000 over the revised estimate for 2001–02.
- **3** The establishment of the Office at 31 March 2002 will be 122 permanent posts and ten temporary posts. It is expected that there will be a net creation of 11 temporary posts in 2002–03.
- **4** Subject to certain conditions, the controlling officer may under delegated powers create or delete non-directorate posts during 2002–03, but the notional annual mid-point salary value of all such posts must not exceed \$45,075,000.
- 5 Provision of \$2,148,000 under *Subhead 002 Allowances* is for standard allowances and the consolidated overtime allowance for Chauffeur grade. This represents an increase of \$1,352,000 (169.8%) over the revised estimate for 2001–02. This is mainly due to increased requirement for overtime allowance and acting allowance in relation to the preparation of the 2003 District Council elections.
 - 6 Provision of \$7,000 under Subhead 007 Job-related allowances is for standard job-related allowances.

Departmental Expenses

- 7 Provision of \$480,000 under *Subhead 110 Honoraria for members of committees* is for paying a monthly honorarium of \$20,000 to each of the two non-official members of the Electoral Affairs Commission.
- **8** Provision of \$10,150,000 under *Subhead 149 General departmental expenses* represents an increase of \$875,000 (9.4%) over the revised estimate for 2001–02. This is mainly due to additional expenses required for contract management of cleaning services devolved from the Government Property Agency, the maintenance of the computer systems and enhancement of office automation.

Other Charges

9 Provision of \$56,779,000 under *Subhead 258 Election expenses* represents an increase of \$41,690,000 (276.3%) over the revised estimate for 2001–02. This is mainly due to additional expenses required for the preparation of the 2003 District Council elections which will include the delineation of constituencies for District Councils, re-allocation of electors to new constituency, drafting the District Council election-related guidelines, publicising and conducting a large scale voter registration campaign, and preparation of subsidiary legislation.
