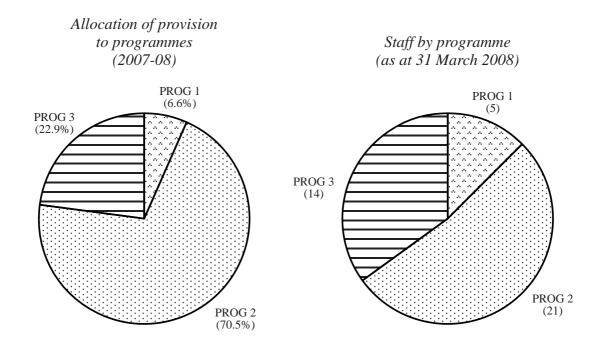

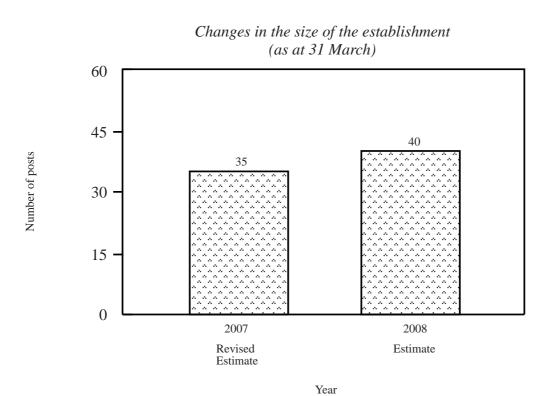
#### Programme (2)

Provision for 2007–08 is \$48.1 million (314.4%) higher than the revised estimate for 2006–07. This is mainly due to the additional provision to strengthen food safety protection, prevent zoonotic diseases and promote the sustainable development of local fisheries industry and other increase in operating expenses. There will be a net creation of five posts in 2007–08.

### Programme (3)

Provision for 2007–08 is \$7.6 million (58.5%) higher than the revised estimate for 2006–07. This is mainly due to the additional provision to prepare for the development of the Poultry Slaughtering and Processing Plant and strengthen support to other environmental hygiene-related initiatives and increase in operating expenses.
