Analysis of Financial and Staffing Provision

Provision for 2019–20 is \$11.3 million (6.4%) higher than the revised estimate for 2018–19. This is mainly due to the increased salary provision for filling of vacancies and staff changes.

Programme (2)

Provision for 2019–20 is \$101.9 million (94.4%) higher than the revised estimate for 2018–19. This is mainly due to the additional provision for the operating expenses for preparing the 21C and conducting the Survey on Persons with Disabilities and Chronic Diseases, as well as the increased salary provision for the creation of posts, filling of vacancies and staff changes. There will be a net increase of 64 posts in 2019–20.










Staff by programme (as at 31 March 2020)

The estimate of the amount required in 2019–20 for the salaries and expenses of the Census and Statistics Department is \$817,789,000. This represents an increase of \$151,787,000 over the revised estimate for 2018–19 and \$173,438,000 over the actual expenditure in 2017–18.

- **2** Provision of \$817,289,000 under *Subhead 000 Operational expenses* is for the salaries, allowances and other operating expenses of the Census and Statistics Department. The increase of \$151,787,000 (22.8%) over the revised estimate for 2018–19 is mainly due to the provision for preparing the 2021 Population Census and conducting the 2019–20 Household Expenditure Survey and Survey on Persons with Disabilities and Chronic Diseases, as well as increased salary provision for filling of vacancies and staff changes.
- 3 The establishment as at 31 March 2019 will be 1 247 permanent posts. It is expected that there will be a net increase of 74 permanent posts in 2019–20. Subject to certain conditions, the controlling officer may under delegated power create or delete non-directorate posts during 2019–20, but the notional annual mid-point salary value of all such posts must not exceed \$571,902,000.
